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A Note from the Director

In 2010, Constance McMillen, a senior at Itawamba Agricultural High School, was banned from attending prom with her girlfriend. The school board canceled the prom entirely after McMillen challenged their decision, leading to a lawsuit and a legal battle that ultimately resulted in a settlement. These events are what *The Prom* is based on.

When I was in grad school, everyone knew I was gay, and people were incredibly friendly to me, and I felt kinship with everyone in my cohort. One day in class, I made a few comments in class about a theory I had in terms of gay actors making powerful theatre in the coming generation. Some people nodded, but I remember that (in my opinion) the reception was lukewarm at best. However, when a classmate of mine whom everyone knew was a cis-white heterosexual male added to my comments in support and agreement, I saw everyone else perk up, nod and make non-verbal sounds of agreement. Suddenly, a full class length discussion was being had around my original idea. I truly did not take offense, but in that moment, I realized what had often happened throughout many times of observation yet never struck me so vividly until now - when the subject surrounding the LGBTQ community came up, people often listened more carefully and/or were more inclined to lend support if an ally spoke up.

And this is why I am so incredibly grateful to each, and every individual connected to this production. Everyone worked their tails off to tell this story in the most honest, passionate, and compelling way. Karen, Heidi, Justin, Ethan, Alex, the rest of the team, and this incredibly talented, hardworking and most respectful cast - I will cherish the sense of community, love, and deep respect we gave each other throughout this process. THANK YOU from the bottom of my unruly heart. What a privilege this experience has been.

So much gratitude to: All LGTBQ students and members of this community of this and previous generations for your bravery and courage to help get us to where we are today. As you can see, there's still so much work to do but you are heroes to the rest of us. The creators of *The Prom* for giving us an opportunity to heal and for teaching us that it's in the moments of adversity, we can become the best versions of ourselves. My brother for always having my back and supporting every theatre project I am involved in. And to our audiences, friends, and all theatre lovers and allies - we NEED you. We need your support. We may be speaking up here and now with our show, but all voices need to come together to get advocacy and have the best chance of acceptance. Please sit back, laugh, smile, cry, and most of all - experience our humble production of *The Prom*.




MEET THE PRODUCTION STAFF (continued)

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
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
