DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The story of *It's A Wonderful Christmas Carol* begins with a friendship. We first met in a production of Guys and Dolls in 2012 and it was quickly apparent that we were kindred spirits, with a shared sense of humor and a fondness for film. On our first project together, *Upstaged The Series*, we discovered that we could meld those passions to create entertainment that appealed to audiences across the spectrum. A partnership was born.

Then came an experiment which began when Joel viewed *It's A Wonderful Life* for the first time and wondered what became of Henry Potter at the end, and if there was any chance that he could be redeemed. It seemed a fun exercise in creativity, and we spent many hours talking about Potter, and what his life might have been like, what his connections to Bedford Falls were, and how much like Ebenezer Scrooge he was. An idea was born.

Tonight, we present the result of that exercise, six years in the making. It's A Wonderful Christmas Carol is a story steeped in the world of Bedford Falls, peopled by characters both familiar and new, filled with the humor, drama, pathos and, ultimately, the message of hope imbued in the original holiday classic.

Our thanks go out to the board of Theatre 121, who took a chance on a new, world premiere play. This production utilizes to the fullest the Woodstock Opera House's recent audio and video upgrades, employed to immerse audiences in the worlds we've borrowed from Frank Capra and Charles Dickens. Our partnership with the Opera House's dedicated, helpful staff has been invaluable, as has the commitment and creativity of the talented cast, crew and production staff who bring this story to life. We are grateful to them all, as well as to you, the audience, for supporting local theatre at a time when every dollar is stretched to the fullest. Thank you, from the bottom of our hearts.
